MESSAGE FROM THE GARRISON COMMANDER

Greetings from Fort Knox!

Since my last column one year ago, a lot has happened on Fort Knox as our Army is in a period of transition.

In May, the 3,500-Soldier 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division held its inactivation ceremony. This unit came to Fort Knox in October 2009, and deployed twice since then in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

While sad to see this outstanding unit go, its Soldiers are to be applauded for their exemplary service to this nation.

Meanwhile, another one of our deployable organizations – the 19th Engineer Battalion – returned from a nine-month deployment to Kuwait where they performed construction missions throughout the Middle East. The unit also returned to a brand-new home – a \$41 million complex that includes all their administrative facilities, barracks and a motor pool. This is a much needed upgrade for the 19th Engineers, as their old facilities exhausted their useful life and were spread out across the post.

The 19th Engineer Battalion also grew over the past year. The 541st Sapper Company and 42nd Clearance Company – both from Bamberg, Germany – joined the battalion, making the 19th Engineers the largest battalion of its type in the Army at about 950 Soldiers.

Another area of growth involves U.S. Army Recruiting Command, which is already headquartered at Fort Knox. The Recruiting and Retention School moved here from Fort Jackson, South Carolina to be more integrated and synchronized with USAREC. The RRS trains and educates military and civilian leaders and develops recruiting and retention doctrine. Comprised of about 95 cadre (Soldiers, Army civilians and contractors), the RRS trains about 3,300 students each year.

And speaking of training, we successfully completed U.S. Army Cadet Command's newly consolidated cadet summer training program here. For years, Fort Knox has been the home of USACC's Leader's Training Course, which totals about 1,500 cadets. But this summer's mission also included USACC's Leader Development and Assessment Course – an increase of about another 5,800 cadets. LDAC was a mission carried out Fort Lewis, Washington previously, but this consolidation is saving the Army up to \$9 million a year. When you factor in that almost 4,500 cadres were brought in to support these courses as well as the hundreds of parents who descended upon Fort Knox to attend their children's graduations, this cadet summer training mission provided a real economic boost to the region – a real win-win situation, in my estimation.

Something else I'm proud to highlight is our upcoming Retiree Appreciation Days on Oct. 31 and Nov. 1. This event is tailored specifically to you and your dependents' needs, providing somewhat of a one-stop shop experience.

Day 1 kicks off at 8:30 a.m. and will go until 4 p.m. Day 2 will also start at 8:30 a.m. and then conclude at noon. So, what can you expect if you go? Well, there will be about 40 booths in the Saber & Quill that will cover a wide range of areas – from health and well-being to legal assistance to shopping opportunities on post (e.g., Commissary and Exchange). ID card processing will also be streamlined for retirees and dependents at White Hall (Bldg. 1384). Seminars on Tricare, Veterans Affairs and Fort Knox transformation will take place as well throughout the two-day event.

I encourage everyone to take full advantage of this opportunity. It's a great example of how people and organizations across the installation come together in support and appreciation of those who've served and set the standard for our military. Thank you, and I look forward to seeing you here soon!

I am excited that our hospital is taking part in Retiree Appreciation Day here at Fort Knox, and we are proud to serve all those who have given so much to the Nation! Ireland Army Community Hospital provides a full spectrum of clinical, laboratory, pharmacy, and imaging services, including Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) and digital mammography. All appointments at Ireland can be made by calling our appointment line at 1-800-493-9602 or through TRICARE Online at <http://www.tricareonline.com/>.

This year we have several programs and campaigns that are geared toward making your health care the best in the area. First, the Direct-in Enrollment Campaign is designed to direct beneficiaries enrolled in TRICARE prime with network providers who reside within 30 minutes' drive of the MTF to enroll with the MTF instead. In supporting this campaign, the MTF will be able to capture network enrollment, maintain funding and sustain staff and services. Investing in your health care this way safeguards the future of our MTF as we continue to provide exceptional patient centered care that exceeds beneficiary expectations. Our #1 priority is to ensure that we provide incomparable Access to Care while maintaining a safe environment for our patients.

Therefore, feel free to share your comments with me. Your input, be it word of mouth, the customer scorecards, or the Army Provider Level Satisfaction Survey, helps us improve our medical facility and services we provide you. Another campaign that is underway is our Performance Triad Campaign which focuses on Sleep, Nutrition and Activity. It brings me great pleasure to announce the initiative is going Army Strong. I have no doubt that our persistent efforts will lead to the adoption of healthy Sleep, Activity, and Nutrition behaviors...instilling healthy habits for life and become our culture. As always, flu shots will be available at this year's Retiree Appreciation Day. Your medical services will also include vision and glaucoma screenings, smoking cessation information, physical therapy (balance and strength testing), and occupational therapy. As in past years, we will also provide the pneumonia vaccine, Pneumovax, at RAD. The pneumonia vaccine is only needed once for those 65 years of age and older. You can also receive the shingles vaccine, Zostavax, while you are here. Zostavax is given to those 60 years and older who have a prescription. Both of these vaccinations are available to you in our Immunization Clinic if you don't get them here at RAD.

Please take the time to visit all of our displays and services here at Retiree Appreciation Day.

NOTES FROM THE RSO

The Fort Knox Retirement Services Office (RSO) is located in White Hall, Bldg 1384, room 103. Operating hours are 7:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Operating hours on Friday are 8:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. You can contact us by calling (502) 624-1765/7236/6419/4641/4315/4141/6995, or by e-mailing: usarmy.knox.imcom-atlantic.mbx.dhr-rso@mail.mil. The RSO is designed to assist Soldiers and their Families making the transition to retirement and to keep them updated on their rights, benefits and privileges after retirement. We coordinate, conduct, and facilitate detailed pre-retirement and Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) briefings. We also provide information related to pre-retirement, such as retirement application processing, retirement orders, DD Form 214 (Certificate or Discharge from Active Duty) processing, final out-processing procedures and Career Status Bonus Election (CSB)/REDUX retirement pay option counseling and processing.

We assist retirees and their Family members with Defense Finance and Accounting System - Cleveland issues/concerns, such as allotments, beneficiary information, bank information, tax withholding status and reissue 1099-R for tax filing. We assist with understanding Combat Related Special Compensation (CRSC) and Concurrent Retirement Disability Payments (CRDP) and obtaining copies of lost documents.

We counsel and assist survivors of retired Soldiers and Soldiers who die on active duty regarding their SBP options and entitlements and the proper processing of the application. The RSO also provides information and assistance to retirees, Soldiers, spouses and former spouses regarding the Uniformed Services Former Protection Act (USFSPA).

Fort Knox has a retiree council that consists of 24 members with a chairman and two co-chairmen. Their mission is to represent the retired military community of all services and grades residing in Kentucky, Illinois, Ohio, West Virginia and Indiana.

The Veterans Service Office (VSO) in Bldg 1384 Chaffee Ave or (502) 624-4103 or Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs (KDVA) Field Representative [REDACTED] in Bldg 1109 or (502) 799-0418 are available to assist you with VA related matters.

Effective 7 September, [REDACTED] assumed the position of Chief, Reserve Component Retirements Branch. Effective October 1, 2014 the RCR Branch will no longer mail out retirement applications to age 60 retirees. We also submit applications for Combat Related Special Compensation (CRSC) and Dependency & Indemnity Compensation (DIC) for all branches of the service.

We are available at our office in Building 1384, Monday through Thursday from 9:00am to Noon. Or you may contact us at (502) 624-4103. We do not make appointments. We operate on a walk-in basis first come first served. We recommend that you arrive at 9:00am or shortly thereafter as our waiting room is frequently crowded by 10:00am. We also insist that you arrive not later than 11:00 to be seen on that day. We have assisted with approximately 900 claims to date in 2014.

If you are in need of assistance with a claim to The Department of Veterans Affairs or applying for Combat Related Special Compensation (CRSC) we would consider it an honor to assist you.

NATIONAL DRUG TAKE-BACK DAY AT FT KNOX IS 27 SEPTEMBER

After seven previous Take Back Days spread over almost four years, 780,158 pounds (390 tons) of pills were brought to the 6,072 collection sites that DEA and its 4,423 state, local, and tribal law enforcement partners set up on April 26 so the public could discard unwanted, unused and expired prescription drugs from medicine cabinets, bedside tables, and kitchen drawers. When added to that collected at previous DEA coordinated Take-Back events, 4.1 million pounds (2,123 tons) of prescription medications have been removed from circulation.
