Exceptions: the following are **NOT** Army Accidents: Combat losses, criminal activity, self-inflicted injuries, fair wear and tear, substance abuse, adverse reactions resulting from drug intake, insect bites, expected or planned damages during authorized testing or disposal, damage incurred aboard commercial carriers, intentionally jettisoned equipment, contractor accidents not involving injury to Army personnel or damage to Army equipment/property, and infective or parasitic diseases.
